

High Fidelity Wraparound

High Fidelity Wraparound (HFW) is a youth and family-guided planning process designed to improve the lives of youth with complex needs. Rather than a program or a type of service, it is a process that is used by communities to support children and youth with complex needs and their families by developing individualized plans of care.

Target Population includes:

- Youth, ages 8 to 21, with a behavioral health disorder
- Youth with complex behavioral health needs
- Diagnosis of serious emotional disturbance or substance abuse disorder
- Youth who are at risk of being placed out of the home
- Youth who are in, or nearing discharge from an out-of-home placement treatment facility or hospitalization
- Youth who have complex emotional and behavioral needs
- High-end users of Behavioral Health Services

High Fidelity Wraparound is a youth & family-guided planning process that is driven by a team-based collaborative process.

What do we do?

The goals of the High Fidelity Wraparound process include:

- Creating a plan to help meet the behavioral health needs prioritized by the youth and family
- Improving the youth and family's ability to manage their own services and supports
- Developing and strengthening the youth and family's natural social support system over time
- Integrating the work of all child-serving systems and natural supports into one organized and effective plan

This process is intended to keep families together in their own homes by teaching them a way to plan for their own needs.

A Unique Team

The High Fidelity Team is responsible for identification, assessment and development of support plans for individuals with high needs. Each team includes:

- A FACILITATOR who guides the High Fidelity Wraparound process and teaches the family how to self-advocate and build upon natural supports.
- A FAMILY SUPPORT PARTNER (FSP) a
 parent or caregiver who has gone through
 similar struggles with their own family and
 as a result, has knowledge of the various
 systems and is able to provide support to
 other parents to help them find their voice.
- A YOUTH SUPPORT PARTNER (YSP) a
 young adult who has overcome his/her own
 life challenges as a youth and as a result,
 has knowledge of the various systems and
 is able to provide support to other youth to
 help them find their voice.
